The group is based around the amazing voice of Dya Singh and presents Sikh hymns, Hindu bhajans, Punjabi qawallis & folk songs and world music improvisations, combining Indian instruments such as harmonium, tablas and santoor with didgeridoo, bouzouki, bohdran, violin, mandolin and guitars.

Bodies collide and cultures clash as two lovers try to understand their personal pasts in the first step toward creating a future together. PRAYER BELLS - PENTEKOSTARION

PRODUCED BY IHOS MUSIC
THEATRE & OPERA

A choral work for 3 solo cantors: Hebrew, Greek and Latin; and 8 male voices with a quarter tone set of 61 specially crafted Hand Bells. Prayer Bells or PENTEKOSTARION is divided into 21 prayers, some of which are performed by bells alone. All bells used in the work were specially commissioned and cast as the Federation Bells for the Centenary of Federation. Cast in six sets of 11 quarter-tone bells, pitched between A and D the bells also represent unity in the work, bridging the cultural and historical boundaries of these three divergent but highly related Hebrew, Greek and Latin chant traditions.

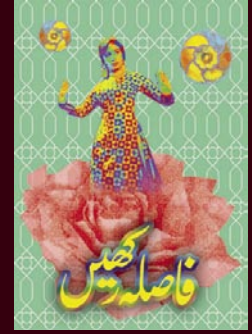
